You'll oversee safety on deck, assist with water quality testing and maintenance, and guide fellow lifeguards through training and support. With a focus on excellent service and teamwork, the Headguard plays a vital role in creating a positive experience for both staff and members. Ideal for experienced lifeguards ready to grow as leaders in a dynamic, community-centered facility.

Key Responsibilities

- 1. Professionalism & Team Conduct
 - Arrive on time, in full uniform, and ready to work as part of a collaborative team
 - Provide primary coverage of lifeguard shifts and ensure consistent supervision of the pool
 - Demonstrate initiative, accountability, and pride in daily duties and member interactions
 - Support and contribute to a respectful, inclusive, and team-oriented work environment

2. Swim Instruction

3. Safety Supervision

- Assess pool usage and conditions to determine appropriate lifeguard coverage;
 adjust supervision ratios as needed to maintain a safe environment
- Provide constant, thorough supervision of assigned pool zones using approved scanning techniques
- Respond confidently and efficiently to emergencies and incidents, administering
 First Aid as required
- Educate patrons on pool rules, facility policies, and water safety practices
- Collaborate with the team to prevent incidents through proactive public education and support
- Follow all class management, emergency response, and safety procedures

4. Customer Service & Communication

- Deliver outstanding customer service and uphold ECAC's standards and policies
- Offer a professional and approachable presence while interacting with members, guests, and families
- Educate users about facility rules, health and safety protocols, and program expectations
- Utilize appropriate communication tools including radios, whistles, hand signals, and body language

- Inspect and report any equipment or safety concerns to supervisors
- Follow safe work practices and support completion of daily and weekly maintenance checklists

- Supervise and mentor lifeguard and instructional staff, providing on-deck leadership and support
- Attend and assist with staff training sessions and professional development events.
- Complete Incident Report Forms as required
- Complete all related instructor administrative duties including; attendance, worksheets, waivers, lesson planning, report cards
- Maintain accurate documentation, including staff certifications, incident reports, and maintenance logs

- Maintain cleanliness and safety of the Aquatic Park
- Ensure safety of staff and patrons in Aquatic Park
- Document and report to your supervisor any incidents that occur during your shift
- Actively involved with workplace inspection and hazard assessments
